Instruction **QUILT** approx. 160 x 160 cm



Materials from Gütermann

- All-purpose sewing thread in a matching colour
- Cotton fabric 145 cm wide, Collection MARRAKESCH:
- 0.90 m small star pattern in beige-blue-orange
- 0.80 m large paisley pattern in beige-multi-coloured
- 1.20 m oriental pattern in beige-white
- 1.70 m flower tendril pattern in beige-white
- 1.70 m small paisley pattern in beige-white
- 0.30 m medallion pattern in beige-white
- 0.20 m rosette pattern in beige-multi-coloured
- 6.70 m grosgrain in olive, 15 mm wide
- 3.00 m grosgrain in light pink, 15 mm wide
- 2.00 m plaited ribbon in light pink, 6 mm wide

Tools

- Sewing machine
- Iron
- Scissors
- Tape measure
- Compass (or a saucer)
- Tailor's chalk or textile marker pen
- Pins
- Optional bias tape maker, 25 mm
- Pressing cloth

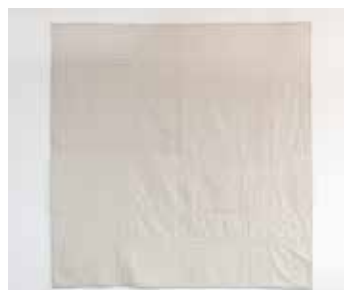

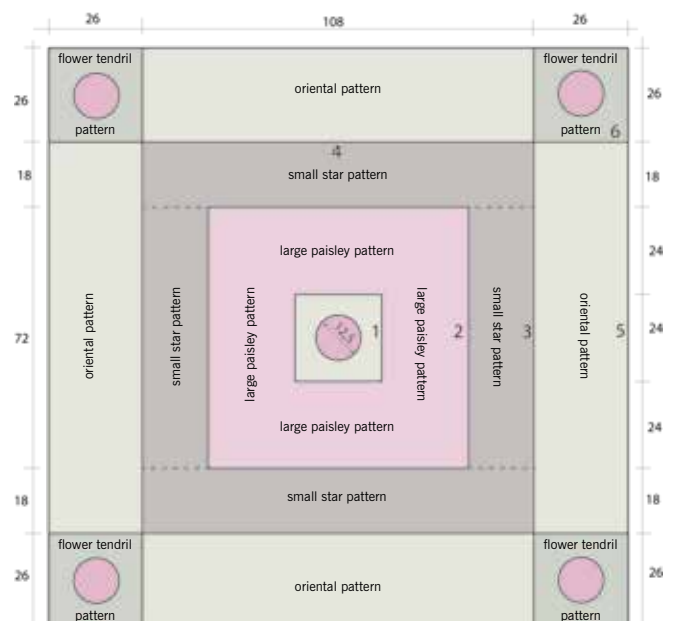
Cutting

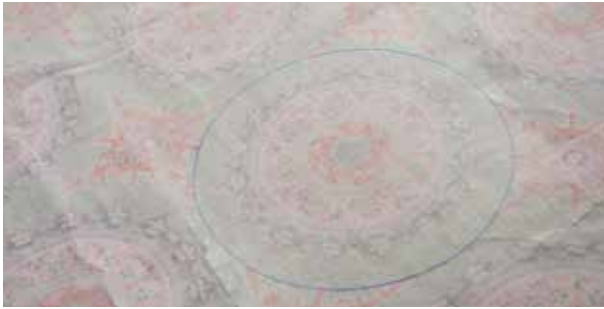
- Small star pattern: Strips (3) 72 x 18 cm 2x, Strips (4) 108 x 18 cm 2x, Edge strips 5 x 84 cm 8x (without seam allowance)
- Large paisley pattern (2): 72 x 72 cm
- Oriental pattern: Strips (5) 26 x 108 cm 4x
- Flower tendril pattern: 26 x 26 cm 4x, 80 x 80 cm 2x (reverse)
- Small paisley pattern: 80 x 80 cm 2x (reverse)
- Medallion pattern (1): 24 x 24 cm, 1x
- Rosette pattern: Ø 12.5 cm with central motif 5x (without seam allowance)
- Volume fleece: 150 x 160 cm 1x; 10 x 150 cm 1x; 10 x 10 cm 1x (cut in pieces)

Cut all pieces with 1 cm seam allowance, with the grain always running parallel to the cut edges.



Cutting plan small star pattern





1. Draw 5 circles with diameters of 12.5 cm on the Thermofix and cut them out roughly. Lay the circles on the back of the rosette pattern centering the rosette within the circle. Lay baking paper on top of this and iron into place. After it has cooled remove the baking paper and cut out the circles along the lines.



2. Find the centre of squares 1, 2 and 6: Fold the squares in quarters, iron the centre and the fold edges in place, then unfold. Lay the rosettes in the middle of squares 1 and 6 and iron them in place. Pin the pink plaited ribbon over the edge of the rosette so that the cut edge is covered. Stitch the beginning of the trimming with approximately 10 zigzag stitches (stitch width 4 mm, stitch length 0.25 mm). Stitch the plaited ribbon all around through the centre using straight stitches. Lay the end of the trimming over the beginning and fix it in place with zigzag stitching. Cut away the end close to the last zigzag stitch.



3. Lay square 1 with the rosette in the middle of square 2, aligning it to the ironed lines. Pin and sew close to the edge. Pin light pink grosgrain over the cut edge mitre the corners. Sew the grosgrain in place close to the edge, neaten the end by folding.



4. Lay strip 3 flush along an edge of paisley square 2 with right sides together and pin in place. Sew the seam 1cm wide, iron seam allowances towards the centre. Sew strip 3 in place on the opposite side and iron. Now sew strips 4 in place on the opposite long sides of the rectangle: Lay the strips with the right sides together and pin in place. Sew the seam 1cm wide, iron towards the centre.



5. Lay strip 5 flush on one cut edge of the previously completed square with right sides together, paying attention to the direction of the pattern. Sew the seam 1cm wide, iron seam allowances towards the centre. Also sew the 2nd strip to the opposite side of the square.



6. Pin one prepared square 6 with a rosette to the ends of each remaining strips 5 with right sides together. Sew the seams and iron the seam allowances open. Pin the strips on the opposite long side of the quilt with right sides together, making sure that all the seams match. Sew the seams and iron the seam allowances to the centre.



7. For the reverse lay one small paisley pattern square and one flower tendril square with right sides together and sew the seam. Iron the seam allowances to one side. Then pin both strips along the long sides with right sides together so that the same patterns are diagonal to one another, the seams meet exactly in the middle. Sew the seam with a width of 1 cm. Iron the seam allowances to one side.



8. Now layer the quilt, with wrong side of the reverse of the quilt uppermost, layer the wadding on top, ensuring all edges meet, then with right side uppermost, place the quilt top on the wadding, again ensuring all side meet. Fix the 3 layers together with plenty of safety pins. Iron the layers together using a damp cloth (or a pressing cloth with steam) in stages for 15 seconds at a time. Then sew the edges of the quilt together 1 cm wide. Trim these edges to 0.5 cm.



Pin the olive-coloured grosgrain over the outer seam lines on the quilt so that the grosgrain covers the seam line. Sew the grosgrain on both sides close to the edge. Also sew grosgrain onto the seam lines running at right angles to this.



9. Sew 2 edge strips in the small star pattern to one another for binding: Sew the ends together with right sides facing. Sew the seam, cut back the seam allowance to a width of 0.5 cm and iron open. Now fold the strip with wrong sides facing and iron the fold line. Then fold in the cut edges along the length with wrong sides together until just before the iron line, also iron the fold lines thus created. This is simpler with a bias tape former. Slide the strip into the former and iron it continuously. Then fold the long edges together with wrong sides together and iron again. Prepare the other edge strips in the same way.



10. Pin one folded edge strip to the reverse with right sides together, flush with the edge of the quilt. Sew along the iron marking. Fold the strip to the front, still folded, and pin it in place over the connecting seam line. Sew close to the edge. Also bind the opposite edge. Cut away the ends of the strips flush with the edges of the quilt.



11. Pin and sew the folded strip over both the last edges with right sides together onto the reverse of the quilt, leaving 1 cm protruding at the ends. Turn the ends to the right side: Pin the end of the strip, folded and with the right sides together. Sew the seam along the outer quilt edge. Cut back the seam allowances. Turn the ends and fold the strip, folded, to the front, whereby the turned ends enclose the cut edges of the first strip. Sew along the fold line close to the edge. Finally also sew the layers of the quilt together along the grosgrain ribbons = quilt.
