Instruction **TABLECLOTH MADE OF RUNNERS**

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Materials from Gütermann

- All purpose thread in a matching colour
- Decorative thread in a matching colour
- Cotton fabric 145 cm wide, Collection MARRAKESCH:
 - 0.90 m flower tendrils in dusty pink
 - 0.90 m small paisley pattern in dusty pink
 - 1.00 m rose pattern in dusty pink-multi-coloured
 - 1.00 m rosette pattern in beige-multi-coloured
- 18.00 m velvet ribbon in light pink, 9 mm wide

In addition

- 6 x 4 cm stiff card

Tools

- Sewing machine
- Iron
- Scissors
- Tape measure
- Tailor's chalk or textile marker pen
- Pins

Size

- approx. 162.5 cm x 210 cm (joined together)
- approx. 162.5 cm x 50 cm (individually)

Fabric combinations

- Runner 1: Panels in rosette pattern dusty pink-multi-coloured, central section flower tendrils in dusty pink
- Runner 2: Panels in small paisley pattern in dusty pink, central section in rosette pattern beige-multi-coloured
- Runner 3: Panels in rosette pattern beige-multi-coloured, central section in small paisley pattern in dusty pink
- Runner 4: Panels in flower tendrils in dusty pink, central section in rosette pattern dusty pink-multi-coloured

Cutting

- Central section: in flower tendrils, paisley and rosette pattern (pay attention to the repeat, see step 1) 137.5 x 50 cm 1x each
- Panels: in flower tendrils, paisley and rosette pattern (pay attention to the repeat, see step 1) 25 x 50 cm 2x each
- 40 ties (velvet ribbon) of 16 cm length each (without seam allowance)

Cut all sections with 1 cm seam allowance, keeping the grain parallel to the cut edges.



1. Caution, pay attention to the repeat when cutting the rosette pattern. For the panel strips use 4 rosettes in length and 2 rosettes in width, add 1cm seam allowance to all edges. The central section is 11 rosettes long and 4 rosettes wide plus seam allowance.



2. Fold the panel length-ways with wrong sides together and iron. Lay the open edges of the panel right sides together onto the short edge of the central section and pin. Sew the seam with a 1 cm seam allowance. Trim together and iron towards the central section. Process the 2nd panel in the same way.



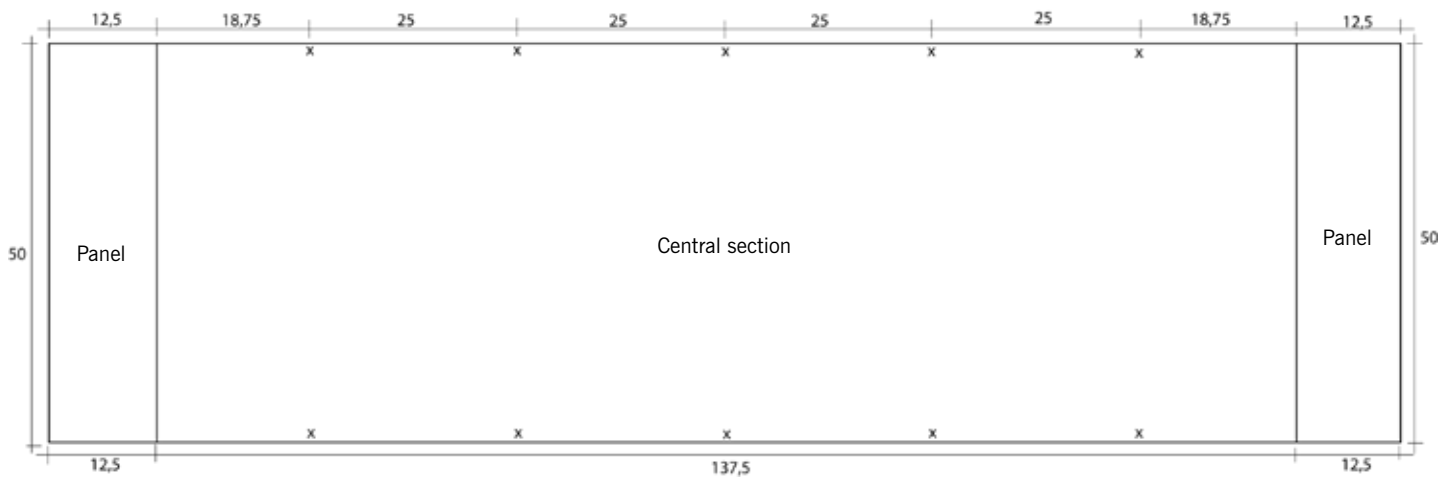
3. Pin the velvet ribbon over both seam lines for the panels on the right runner side down the centre. Sew into place on both sides close to the edge.



4. Fold the long sides of the runner 1cm wide to the right side and iron the fold line. Trim the seam allowance to 0.5 – 0.7 cm. Pin the velvet ribbon over the seam allowances flush with the outer fold line. Form a 1.5 cm loop at each end in order to tie in the tassels, insert the end of the ribbon between the panel and under the velvet ribbon. Insert 16 cm velvet ribbons to the points on the pattern marked with 'x' between the seam allowance and the velvet ribbon and pin in place (see diagram). Sew the velvet ribbons on close to the edge of both sides, fixing the binding bands and the loops at the ends.



5. Wrap the light pink decorative thread around the card for the tassels. Insert a thread of 20 cm length under the wrapped thread and use it to tie the wrapped threads together tightly. Remove the card and cut through the wrapped loops. Now tie around the tassel head approximately 1.5 cm under the knotted loops and knot the thread multiple times. Use the single thread to tie the tassel to the loop on the runner. Make a total of 16 tassels.



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
